The **Berlinale Special** and **Berlinale Special Gala** are programmes curated by the Festival Director that present both extraordinary new productions (feature films and documentaries) as well as films by or about outstanding personalities of film whom the festival is especially attached to. The Berlinale Special programmes are upon invitation only and do not receive submissions.

The **Panorama** within the Official Programme presents new works by well-known directors, as it showcases debut films and exciting new discoveries. The selection of films gives an overview of trends in art-house world cinema. Contact: panorama@berlinale.de

New trends in world cinema, fresh narrative forms and new voices receive special attention in the **Forum**. Narrative features that go beyond the mainstream are presented alongside of documentary and hybrid forms. The **Forum** highlights directorial debuts and innovative works by younger filmmakers. **Forum Expanded** is dedicated to the boundaries between cinema and visual arts and is curated by the **Forum** upon invitation only and does not receive submissions. Submission: available from early September only via www.berlinale.de →

Deadline for submission: October 31, 2016, for feature-length films / November 15, 2016 for short films

Entry fee: € 150 feature-length films / € 60 short films

Date of completion: within the 12 months prior to festival

Premiere Status: World or international premieres are given priority, however, the sections have different requirements

(see list). German films need to be world premieres, except those submitted to Perspektive Deutsches Kino.

Accepted formats for selection: Blu-ray/DVD (region free /all regions), DCP, file upload. Technical Specifications → **Documentation for submission:** Duly completed entry form, full contact details of production companies, synopsis,
